




### **MISSION STATEMENT**



### RECREATION



PICKLEBALL In 2023, we partnered with Bloomfield Hills Schools District to offer indoor pickleball for the first time at West Hills Middle School (now Lone Pine Elementary). This allowed us to complement our spring, summer and fall outdoor offerings and keep our pickleballers active year round. We have pickleball courts at Drake Sports Park as well as tennis courts with pickleball lines painted at both Drake and Keith Sports Parks. Overall, we had 962 registrations for our pickleball clinics, ladders and leagues.

**SUMMER CAMP** Our sell-out, traditional day camp, called Camp WB, expanded participation numbers back to what we offered before the Covid-19 pandemic began. This popular camp offers new field trips each week, visits to the Lily Pad Springs splash pad, nature days at Marshbank Park and more. In 2023, we had 160 Camp WB participants. We also provided an additional **524 camp experiences** through our contracted camp providers which include sports, STEM and art programs.

**WALK WB** Our free, twice-weekly walking club visits various parks and trails throughout the Township. In 2023, we had 179 registered participants that walked more than 4,000 miles in total. This program promotes health and wellness while encouraging social interaction. It is sponsored by Henry Ford Health and select events include talks by doctors and other health experts.

LILY PAD SPRINGS SPLASH PAD In 2023, we had 19,318 visits to the splash pad. This park, opened in 2021, continues to be a draw for West Bloomfield residents and the Metro Detroit region as a whole. It is the largest splash pad in Michigan and features over 50 play features.

#### Sensory Friendly Mondays & Twilight Sessions -

For the second year, we offered Sensory Friendly Mondays for children who may find the splash pad overwhelming on a regular day. These special sessions had limited attendance capacities and some of the overhead spray features turned off. This program reflects WB Parks' commitment to inclusion. We also offered Twilight Sessions on select Tuesday evenings so working parents could enjoy the splash pad with their families after the workday.

Summer Camps - Ten summer camps around Metro Detroit chose Lily Pad Springs as a field trip destination with more than 500 visits from campers. These special sessions were offered in addition to our regular daily schedule.

Private party rentals - In 2023, we offered a limited amount of private party rentals to West Bloomfield residents only. The package included an hour on the splash pad and an hour under the tent just outside of the pad for gathering. These rental opportunities all sold out within a matter of days.

## **NATURE**



GUIDED HIKES Guided nature hikes are one of our most popular program offerings with residents often requesting more. In 2023, we expanded our offerings and hosted 31 different hikes which include Hike with a Hero, Senior Hikes, Little Hikers (family hikes) and other seasonal themed hikes.

NEW PROGRAMS Thanks to our creative team of naturalist professionals, we offered more new programs in 2023 than ever before. On top of our usual offerings, we had a total of 19 new programs or series including Senior Kayaking, Fish with a Hero and Spooky Animal Storytime.

NATURE APPOINTMENTS Nature appointments are special programs led by our naturalists either on-site in the Nature Room or offsite at a school, community partner's facility, etc. They are not open to the public and are customized to a specific group's needs. In 2023, we led 24 appointments servicing a total of 556 people. We also host outreach stations at other community events to reach and educate new audiences. This year, we reached an additional 455 people through these partnerships.

### NATURE-THEMED COMMUNITY EVENTS

Each year, our nature team offers large, family events that serve a dual purpose. They provide fun, seasonal activities while educating and immersing families in nature. These events support our mission of instilling a love of nature in our residents with the ultimate goal of helping create future stewards of our natural resources. In 2023, we offered three of these events - Bees, Butterflies & Blooms, Earth Day Celebration and Camp Out, each of which had more than 250 people in attendance.

### **NATURAL FEATURES INVENTORY** A Natural Features

Inventory is a survey of park lands to help define what type of natural community it is (aka what type of habitat it is) and ranks each area from 1-5 in ecological biodiversity, 5 being the best. This data helps to guide land managers to prioritize and direct their land management decisions with the best ecological choices. In 2023, surveys were completed for 9 park sites by a contractor specializing in this work. In total, WB Parks has 108 tree stands (33 forested, 75 non-forested). The average age of the dominant tree species within forested stands was 67 years and the oldest tree found was a 181 year old oak. The overall eco-score average of all park properties surveyed combined is a 2.1. The areas with a higher score will have more extensive surveys conducted in 2024 to look for rare plant and animal species. Several park parcels received a 4/5 eco score including areas in Drake Sports Park, Pine Lake Park and the WB Woods Nature Preserve.

GREEN TEAM WB Parks' Green Team is an organization-wide collaboration. The Green Team sets goals, implements new staff procedures and deploys public relations campaigns to help reduce our collective impact on the earth. In 2023, we hosted green team stations at certain events, launched "Caught being Green" pins to encourage positive behaviors and made 9 product swaps to greener choices for programs. Additionally, our parks team purchased 6 pieces of electric equipment to continue our efforts to phase out gas-powered models as well as installed refillable water bottle stations at 3 additional parks.

### **SENIORS**



### A NEW SPACE

In August 2023, WB Parks re-opened its senior center, called Connect, in a new leased space located at 14 Mile and Farmington Roads. The 9,000 sg foot space features a large room for events, fitness classes and drop-in programs as well as a lounge area for seniors to gather and socialize. The leased space supports WB Parks long-term goal of offering a community center for seniors to utilize. Connect is located at 33230 W 14 Mile Rd., West Bloomfield, MI 48322 and is open Monday-Friday from 8:30 am-4:00 pm.

The new space now supports more than 600 members with a variety of free or low cost programs. There have been more than 5,000 visits from members since the facility opened. This data does not include seniors who visit that are not Connect members.

### HOLIDAY LUNCHES

Some of our most anticipated senior programs are our annual holiday lunches we offer each season. We mix up what holidays we celebrate but in 2023, we hosted events for the Chinese New Year, St. Patrick's Day, Tiger's Opening Day, Harvest Day and more. These events typically sell out and we look forward to expanding our maximum capacity in 2024 now that we are in a larger space. In 2023, we served 357 meals across 7 events.

### DROP IN PROGRAMS

Several of our drop in programs have grown in popularity with the opening of our new facility. The first is our free, twice weekly exercise program called Stretch & Tone. This program helps keep seniors active and healthy. We had more than 100 seniors registered for the program this year. The second is our Ping Pong program that also takes place twice a week. This program has really allowed us to expand our customer base to a new user group.

### **GRANTS FOR SENIOR SERVICES**

West Bloomfield was one of 11 communities awarded the full Oakland Together Senior Center Grant (\$250,000) and one of ten to receive the Administration for Community Living funding for seniors (\$85,000).





## PARK PROJECTS







#### PINE LAKE PARK

WB Parks took over operations of the former Pine Lake Elementary property located at 3333 W. Long Lake Road, beginning on October 1, 2023. The West Bloomfield Parks and Recreation Commission and the Bloomfield Hills School Board of Education entered into a 20year lease agreement where the 21 acre plot will be maintained and improved by WB Parks while the School District will still hold ownership over the property. WB Parks is currently undergoing a master planning process for the site that will result in a phased plan of park improvements over the next 5 years. Planned upgrades include new playground structures, pickleball courts, an upgraded baseball field and more.

### **MEMORIAL BENCHES**

In 2023, WB Parks revamped its memorial bench program. This process included creating an inventory of all park benches in the system as well as determining which benches were ready for replacement. Each park location was mapped out with available benches listed for sale. We generated \$20,000 in revenue through the program and have several benches already under contract for 2024. This revenue covers all costs including installation and maintenance. In total, we have nearly 140 benches in our park system that are managed through the memorial program. ### **SKATE PARK**

WB Parks redesigned and replaced all of the ramps and equipment at the skate park in Drake Sports Park. The original structures were installed in the early 2000s and were in need of replacement. We surveyed community members and park users to help select a design. The new structures were installed in late fall and the park will officially reopen in the spring of 2024.

# **COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS**





WB TOWNSHIP LIBRARY WB Parks partnered with the West Bloomfield Township Public Library to create a storybook walk along the trails on the Civic Center Campus. WB Parks maintains the trails and the Library updates the story each season. This partnership aligns with both of our missions by promoting literacy and exploring nature. We also partner with the Library on events such as the Kids Komotion Concert and programming such as performers in the park for summer camps.



### **DIVERSITY TASK FORCE**

The West Bloomfield Diversity Task Force is a partnership between WB Parks, the WB Public Library, WB Township and community volunteers. The

goal of the Task Force is to recognize the cultural, ethnic, and religious differences represented in West Bloomfield. The group formed in 2020 and hosted several events in 2023 to support its mission including a Black Expo, a community celebration called "Meet Your Neighbors" and educational series covering topics like LGBTQ+ 101 and cultural awareness of the Chaldean community.

SENIOR SAFETY TEAM Launched in 2023, the Senior Safety Team brings together senior service providers to collaborate on ways to preventing falls and minimize risk among our senior community. The group is made up of representatives from Jewish Senior Life, the West Bloomfield Fire Department, WB Parks and Henry Ford Health.

SENIOR RESOURCE GROUP (SRG) The SRG is a network of professionals that look to connect seniors with resources and is organized through the West Bloomfield Chamber. WB Parks partners with the group to offer a monthly lecture series as well as trips to exciting destinations. This partnership allows us to connect seniors with subject matter experts while also offering affordable programming through the group's sponsorships. In 2023, we offered 10 trips and had a total attendance of more than 300 during the monthly Talk Time series.

#### **CONSERVATION PARTNERS**

In 2023, WB Parks really focused on expanding its relationships with conservation partners. We worked with 25 different groups including Bees in the D, Friends of the Rouge, North Oakland Wild Ones and Monarch Watch. If you're interested in partnering with us, contact info@wbparks.org.



# STAFF HIGHLIGHTS



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT WB Parks strives to offer relevant professional development opportunities to all of its staff members. This year, staff attended trainings such as Managing Time Effectively, Verbal Diffusion/De-Escalation Training, Michigan Parks & Recreation Association's Annual Conference, Michigan Association of Senior Centers Annual Conference and more. Two team members became Certified Dementia Practioners, a new certification for our organization.

**PARK OPERATIONS** Safety training and continuing education is a top priority for our park operations team. In 2023, they spent 373 hours in professional development trainings and collectively hold 74 certifications. Examples of these certifications include Certified Playground Inspectors, Invasive Species Certification and Man Lift Safety Certification.

**NEW PERSONNEL** We hired our first Human Resources Manager in WB Parks history to focus on staff development, appreciation and recruitment.
